Q.1 Attempt the following objective type questions. [20]

A) Complete the following statements by choosing the correct alternative given in the bracket and rewrite the statement. (5)

Total marks – 5, five statements each carry one mark each. No internal options given for this question.

B) Correct the incorrect pair and rewrite the correct one. (5)

Total marks – 5, It has five sets, each having four pairs. Each set has one incorrect pair, student must find the incorrect pair and rewrite the correct answer. No internal options given for this question.

- C) Identify the appropriate term from the given option in the box and rewrite it against the given statement. (5)

Total marks – 5, Concepts would be given in the box, students must select the correct concept for the given statement and rewrite the answer. No internal option given for this question.

- D) Correct the underlined words and complete the statement. (5)

Total marks – 5, this question has five statements carrying one mark each. In each statement student must correct the underlined word and rewrite the statement. No internal option given for this question.

- Q. 2) Write short notes (Any two) (8)

Total marks – 8, In this section three questions carrying four marks are asked, any two out of the three must be attempted.

- Q. 3) Write differences (Any three) (12)

Total marks – 12, In this section five questions carrying four marks each are asked, any three must be attempted. Differences must be written in point wise.

- Q. 4) Explain the following concepts with examples (Any two) (8)

Total marks – 8, In this section three questions each carrying four marks are asked, any two must be attempted.

Answer should include:

- Meaning of the concept; 1 mark.
- Explanation of the concept; 2 marks.
- Example 1 Mark.

- Q. 5 (A) Complete the concept map. (4)

Total marks – 4, this question is based on the diagram which is given on the intermediate concept of any chapter (flowchart, complete the chart and concept map). Concept related four blanks must be filled to complete the diagram. No internal option given for this question.

B) State whether the following statements are true or false with reasons. (Any three) (8)

Total marks – 8, three statements carrying four marks each are given, any two must be attempted.

Answer should include:

True or False - 1 mark
Reasons (minimum three points with explanation) - 3 marks

Q. 6A) Read the following passage and answer the questions given below. (6)

Total marks – 6, Passage shall be given from the textbook.

Sociological concepts related content from the textbook will be given as passage, two questions carrying three marks each are given. Questions are based on application. Answer must include concept knowledge, understanding of the topic and sociological analysis.

Answer should include:

- Knowledge of the content; 1 mark.
- Explanation of the content; 2 marks.

B) Give your personal response (Any one) (4)

Total marks – 4, two questions carrying four marks each are given, any one must be attempted.

Student has to give their opinion; answer must be based on knowledge, understanding and application

Total marks – 10 marks, Attempt any one out of the two. Application skills based questions must be asked in this segment. Key points/hints can be given to frame the answer.
